

After receiving over 260 applications from around the world, the 2022 Swiss Refoundation "Entrepreneurs for Resilience Award" has selected cluster partner Stre@mlineHealth to receive one of threegrants as well as a nomination for a People's Choice Award!



Their project proposal aims to strengthen the Kisiizi Community Health Insurance Scheme (the oldest and largest in Uganda) and to replicate it in 14 other hospitals or large clinics across Uganda, providing affordable access to quality health care.

Samuel Mugisha, Executive Director of Stre@mline Health, and his team partnered with us to integrate the <u>Smart Triage</u> and <u>Smart Discharges</u> algorithms for improving care for children with sepsis at Kisiizi Hospital in Uganda. This collaboration focused on the development of a pediatric quality improvement and triage program supported by technology.

#ICYMI: The third series of the Action on Sepsis Podcast is now available!



Our final series was released in June and tells the story of **Shannon McKenney**, a Juno-nominated singer and survivor of recurrent sepsis. This series features discussions with sepsis researcher **Dr Robert Hancock** (UBC), quality improvement expert **Sarah Carriere** (<u>BC Sepsis Network</u>), and knowledge translation and patient-oriented research experts **Dr Larry Mroz** and **Dr Lynne Feehan** (<u>BC SUPPORT Unit</u>).

Congratulations to our recent grant recipients!



Dr Amy Lee (SFU) and **Dr Pascal Lavoie** have received a CIHR Project Grant to investigate the <u>molecular epidemiology of neonatal sepsis in low- and middle-income countries</u>, along with Dr Robert Hancock, Dr Matthew Wiens, Dr Constantin Popescu, and Dr Nathan Kenya-Mugisha.

Dr Srinivas Murthy (UBC) is one of 8 PIs from across Canada awarded a CIHR Project Grant for the <u>Canadian ADAptive Platform Trial of COVID-19 Therapeutics in Community Settings (Can-ADAPT COVID)</u>. Secondary outcomes in the trial will include the impact of therapeutics on long-COVID. Dr Srinivas Murthy has also been named a member of the <u>2022 Wall Scholar Catalyst Cohort</u>.

Dr Marianne Vidler (UBC) and **Dr Stephen Rulisa** (University of Rwanda) have been awarded a CIHR Planning & Dissemination Grant to <u>identify gaps in post-Caesarean care and resulting infections in Rwanda</u>, along with Dr Deborah Money.

Dr Matthew Wiens (UBC) has been awarded a CIHR Planning & Dissemination Grant to develop a scalable platform for integrating data-driven algorithms that drive quality improvement in pediatric sepsis care at health facilities in Uganda, along with Dr Yashodani Pillay (UBC), Clare Komugisha (Walimu), and Dr Nathan Kenya-Mugisha (Walimu).



Due: Sep 15, 2022 **Award**: \$5,000 USD

Open to applicants living and working in a <u>science-and technology-lagging country (STLCs)</u>. This grant supports women in the early stages of their scientific careers who have made a demonstrable impact on the research environment, both at a regional and international level, and have received their PhD in STEM in the last 10 years.
