Research Updates

Supporting the fight against COVID-19:



Findings from the **COVID-19 Immunity Task Force**, including cluster members **Dr David Goldfarb** and **Dr Pascal Lavoie**, demonstrate that individuals who had a longer time interval between COVID-19 mRNA vaccines had a significantly higher level of antibodies regardless of which mRNA vaccine was administered. <u>Dataverse</u> is an open-source data repository that enables <u>Sepsis CoLab</u> Members to 1) access guidelines, tools, algorithms, and many other resources; 2) access and share data through data sharing agreements; and 3) securely store data. BILL & MELINDA GATES foundation

Strengthening Data Science Capacity and the Ecosystem: Enabling Data-Centered Public Health Interventions

Due: Jan 13, 2022

Aims to fund 2 cross-cutting cores to (a) develop data governance data science capacity and standards and (b) build data science capacity, as well as 2 data reuse projects that focus on a specific disease area. Requires collaboration between researchers in at least 2 countries based in any of the following regions: Africa, India, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Nepal, and Brazil. \$250,000 USD over 18-24 months. <u>Details here.</u>

Metagenomic Next Generation Sequencing to Detect, Identify, and

Characterize Pathogens

Due: Jan 13, 2022

Supports travel and accommodation of grantees to San Francisco for training at the CZ Biohub, and the following items: 1) a sequencer suitable for the global health environment, 2) a dedicated sequencing technician, and 3) sequencing reagents for the duration of the award. CZ Biohub and CZI training will include pilot analysis of samples from their home region during hands-on, intensive mentoring. <u>Details here.</u>
